Ruby Valley Hospital Welcomes Healthcare Providers

The Ruby Valley Hospital is pleased to welcome Dr. Molly Biehl and Drew Chambers, PA-C, to our community. Dr. Biehl and Mr. Chambers were recently hired by the Ruby Valley Hospital and the Ruby Valley Clinics. In addition to providing medical support at the clinic, in the emergency room and on hospital rounds, they bring new perspectives and choices to the Ruby Valley's healthcare system.

Dr. Biehl is a Montana native, born in Billings and raised in Red Lodge and Great Falls. Following her graduation from M.S.U. with a bachelor's degree in Biomedical Sciences, she attended Touro University Nevada, College of Osteopathic Medicine. Dr. Biehl says that she chose osteopathic medicine because it uses techniques that make it easier to practice traditional medicine. In 2008, she earned her Doctorate of Osteopathic Medicine. Dr. Biehl is board certified in Family Practice. In 2011, she completed the Family Practice Residency Program in Eastern Maine and has been employed



with the Health Access Network and Millinocket Regional Hospital. "I take calls regularly for adult and pediatric cases at the hospital, including critical care" says Dr. Biehl.

Dr. Biehl says that she always planned to return to Montana. Her parents live in Missoula. As she and her fiancé, a hunting and fishing guide and outfitter, prefer small towns and outdoor recreation, the Ruby Valley was at the top of her list. "The staff at the hospital had a very positive impact on my decision to come to Sheridan. Also, when we went to the café and walked around town, everyone was so genuinely friendly. It's like home." Dr. Biehl will be joining Ruby Valley Hospital and Clinics in July, 2014.

You might have seen Drew Chambers at one of the Ruby Valley clinics last summer while he was completing his clinical rotation in Outpatient Medicine. During his rotation, he became enchanted with the Ruby Valley, the small towns and all the outdoor activities available in Southwestern Montana. Chambers and his wife, Emma, are avid snowboarders, skiers, mountain bikers, campers

and peak baggers. (He has climbed 35 of the 54 peaks in Colorado that are over 14,000 feet high.) “The people, the small towns and the quality of life that goes hand in hand has me longing to be back,” says Chambers. “Working with the healthcare professionals and staff at Ruby Valley Hospital has been a truly great experience.”

Chambers’ first career interest was not medicine. He is a snowboarder extraordinaire. After four



years of competitive snowboarding, and many injuries, his career path shifted to sports medicine. While continuing his snowboarding in less aerial competitions, Chamber’s earned his bachelor’s degree in Kinesiology from the University of Colorado, Boulder and completed specialty sports medicine training. For eleven years, he worked as the Head Certified Athletic Trainer with Vail-Summit Orthopaedics and Avalanche Physical Therapy in Frisco, Colorado, providing sports medicine and training to various schools and programs in Summit County, Colorado. After working closely with many Physician Assistants, Chambers decided to enroll

in the Physician Assistant Studies program at University of Alabama at Birmingham where he emphasized Emergency Medicine and Orthopaedic Surgery. He received his Masters of Physician Assistant Studies in December.

Chambers started work with the Ruby Valley Hospital on March 3rd and will be available to see patients around March 17th. He is very excited about settling into Sheridan and learning all the local wisdom. His wife will be joining him in May after completing her master’s degree in archeology at the University of Alabama.
